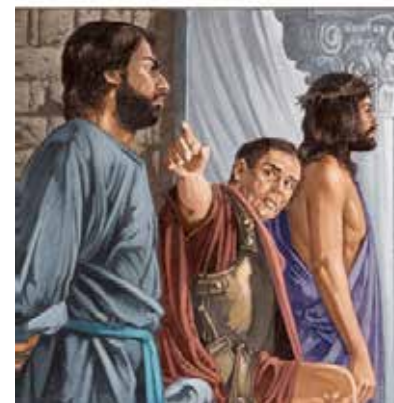
Then the men stepped forward. They grabbed Jesus and arrested him.

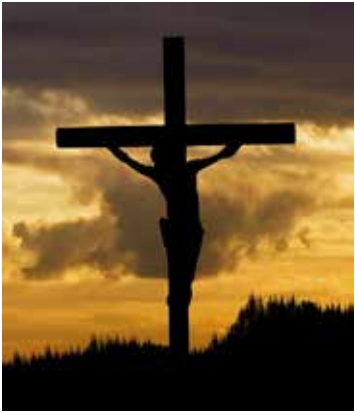
Matthew 26:39

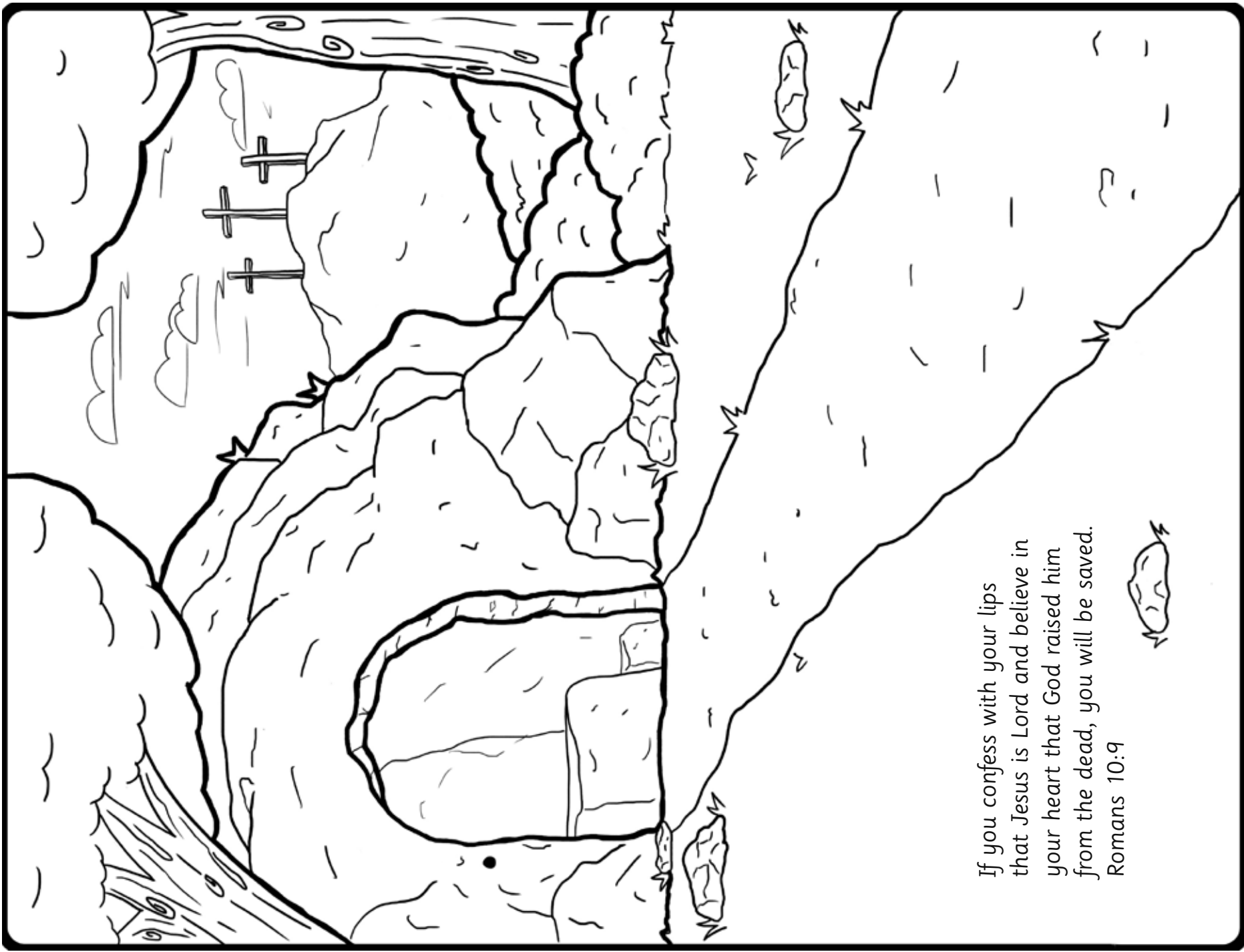
Matthew 27:45-51

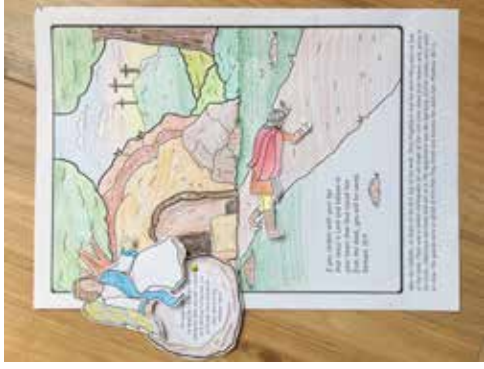


If you confess with your lips

from the dead, you will be saved.

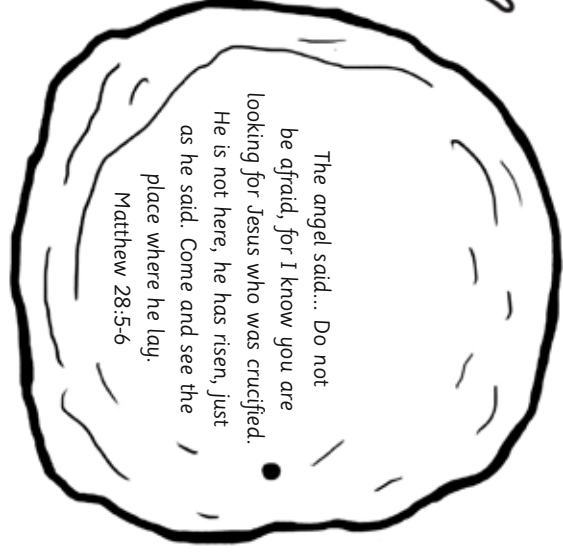

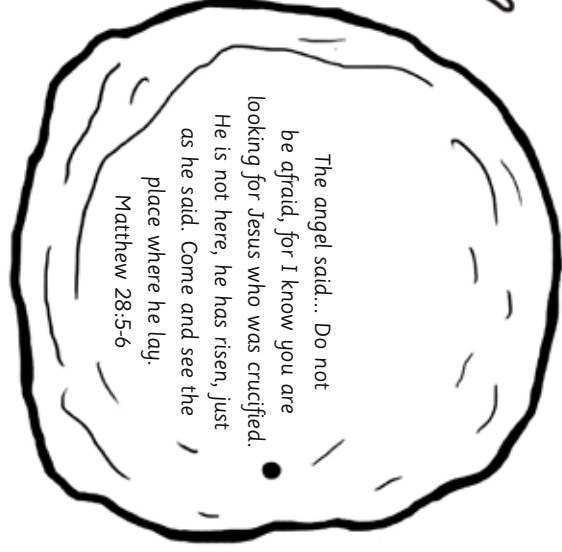
